

Dear Friend,



With four school-aged children to feed, Bethany and her husband are experiencing the insecurity

of his seasonal work. He works in construction, and even though jobs are plentiful right now, he and Bethany are still catching up on bills and expenses left over from the winter months. when work was exceptionally

slow. That makes affording all the necessities - like healthy food for their children – a struggle.

And with summer vacation on the horizon, parents like Marie face the added challenge of replacing the meals her son won't receive for free in his school's cafeteria.
