Eddie's life changed completely when he was involved in a traumatic car accident. He broke 34 bones and eventually lost his leg. Years later, Eddie is still not healthy enough to work and depends on a small monthly disability check.

His wife, Tonya, helps care for Eddie and her sister, who also has a disability. To further complicate the family's situation, Tonya was recently diagnosed with cancer.

With the serious health problems they are facing, good nutrition is absolutely vital for Eddie and Tonya as they age. Were it not for your generosity, they would not be able to receive the healthy food they need to heal.

The stuff I get helps me through the month," Mike says as he fills his bag with nutrient-rich spinach.
"I'd be malnourished without this."

We met Mike during a visit to Our Daily Bread, a Food Bank partner in Wichita. As he gathered nutritious items from the pantry's full shelves, Mike spoke about how difficult it had been for him to raise a family with his injuries.

You see, Mike — who is now in his 70s — took a hard fall at age 25. He has been paralyzed from his hips to his head ever since. Mike's workers compensation expired after five years, so he has lived off a limited fixed income for most of his life.

His roommate helps him get around, but Mike often struggles financially each month. He says nearly all his Social Security check goes to bills — which means any extra costs are a real challenge.



A couple years ago Mike's home was damaged by a tornado, and the extra expense meant he could no longer afford bills or groceries. During the cold winter months, the added cost to heat his home puts Mike in a tough position and he has to choose whether to pay for utilities or buy food.

Your support brings relief. He is so grateful that you help keep the food pantry stocked.
